Jonah 1:1-3 (ESV)

**1 Now the word of the LORD came to
Jonah the son of Amittai, saying,
2 “Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city,
and call out against it....”**

Jonah 1:1-3 (ESV)

³ But Jonah rose to flee to Tarshish from the presence of the LORD. He went down to Joppa and found a ship going to Tarshish. So he paid the fare and went down into it, to go with them to Tarshish, away from the presence of the LORD.

Jonah 1:9 (ESV)

⁹ And he said to them, “I am a Hebrew, and I fear the LORD, the God of heaven, who made the sea and the dry land.”

Jonah 1:14-15 (ESV)

14 Therefore they called out to the LORD, “O LORD, let us not perish for this man’s life, and lay not on us innocent blood, for you, O LORD, have done as it pleased you.” 15 So they

- 4 Then I said, ‘I am driven away from your sight; yet I shall again look upon your holy temple.’**

5 The waters closed in over me to take my life; the deep surrounded me; weeds were wrapped about my head

7 When my life was fainting away, I remembered the Lord, and my prayer came to you, into your holy temple.

8 Those who pay regard to vain idols forsake their hope of steadfast love.

will sacrifice to you; what I have
vowed I will pay.**
